From The Principal

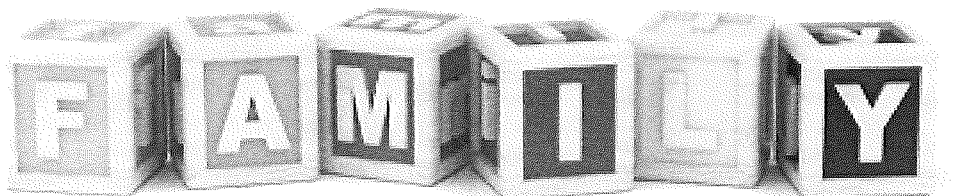
Dear Parents / Guardians,

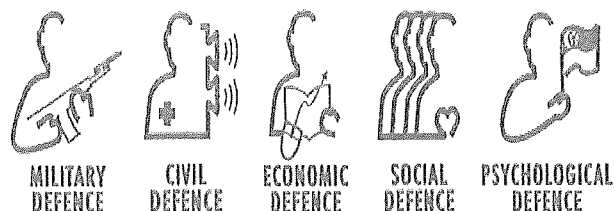


In summary, to build this Punggol View Family, we will need the 4Cs

Total Defence Day on Monday 15 Feb 2016



Total Defence Day is held every year to remind ourselves of what happens when we are not able to defend ourselves. **On Monday 15 Feb 2016, the Public Warning Important Message Signal will be sounded at 6.20 pm** to mark the time that Singapore fell to the Japanese 74 years ago. Please do not be alarm by the sound of the sirens. A good habit is to alert our children and to tune in to any local FM radio station for public announcements. Our forefathers learned an important lesson in 1942 that the defence of our country would be up to us, and no one else.

Today, the threat of war may seem far away. However, recent terrorist attacks in Paris, Istanbul, and closer home in Bangkok and Jakarta remind us that we must never take for granted the

safety and security of Singapore. All around the world, there are groups of misguided and ill-intentioned people who want to disrupt and threaten the safety and security of peaceful countries and communities. With the Internet, these groups can now reach out to like-minded individuals all around the world.

Total Defence is our response to these threats. All of us in Singapore, regardless of race and religion, must be alert, united, and determined to reject the ideas that seek to divide and destroy us as a Country. The Singapore Armed Forces, the Home Team and other government agencies are doing their best to keep Singapore safe and secure every day. But they cannot do it alone. All Singaporeans must stand shoulder to shoulder against any force that seeks to undermine our social, economic and psychological defences.

In school, we will be engaging our students in several aspects of Total Defence. On Thursday 11 Feb 2016, our P1 students learned the role of our Singapore Armed Forces (SAF) service men and women in protecting Singapore (Military Defence). The P2 on Civil Defence and the role of our Singapore Police Force, the P3 on our Singapore Civil Defence Force and the P4 on Social Defence and the role of the volunteers like Residents' Committees / People's Association members who come forward to help others like the needy families in the community. Our students would also be tasked to pen down words of appreciation to these "wonderful heroes" in a specially designed Thank You cards. We will be presenting the cards to the various agencies such as the Punggol Neighbourhood Police Centre, Punggol Vista CC and SCDF 2nd Div on Monday 15 Feb 2016. This will be a good way for our students not only to have head knowledge about Total Defence but also to express their feeling and appreciation to our fellow country men and women who are doing their best to keep Singapore safe and secure every day.

We will also be encouraging our students to play their part by making strong friendships with other students of different races and religions. Singapore's vibrant, multi-cultural society makes us special and strong, and we must stand together as one united people against any threat to our country. We also hope to engage you, our parents to renew our commitment to keep each other safe, and together keep Singapore strong.

School Routines and Procedures

We would like to inform you of the following routines and procedures to ensure the smooth operations of the school and to create a safe and secure environment for all our students:

a. Safety and Security

- Please drive safely and slowly along Punggol Place. Our students are very precious to us and we will not want any careless driver to cause an accident.
- Parents / Guardians have to obtain a visitor's pass at the gate for security reasons during normal curriculum time. We have to tighten our security in line with the government's security guidelines.
- We need your cooperation and understanding on this. We do not make apologies for being rule-bound as our students are very precious to us and we take safety and security matters very seriously to ensure our parents/guardians have peace of mind knowing that their children are in a safe environment.

b. Absence from School

- Please ensure that your child is well before sending him / her to school. As children play and interact with one another in close proximity, it is easy for them to pick up

viruses and germs. If your child is unwell, please take him / her to see a doctor and get the doctor to issue an MC.

- Should your child be absent from school, we would like you or your child to contact the Form Teacher or leave a message for the Form Teacher. We will also be contacting you as soon as we can should your child fail to report to school. To facilitate this channel of communication, we would appreciate it if you could provide us with your recent handphone number or contact number. Please do alert us immediately if you decide to change your contact number. In so doing we hope to work very closely with you to ensure that your child comes to school regularly.

c. Health Matters

- We encourage you to ensure that your child eats his / her breakfast before he / she comes to school. Research has shown that there is a strong correlation between performance in academic studies and whether the child eats a meal or not. We would be grateful if you could also encourage your child to eat healthily as we certainly do not want our students to become unfit and suffer from obesity. Also do encourage your child to sleep early and to have at least 9 to 10 hours of sleep.

d. Giving Constructive Feedback

- We are very privileged to have you as our supportive parent/guardian. We hope to invite you to participate in the school's programmes and volunteer selflessly. We hope you could support us as Parent Volunteers or even join the Parents' Support Group as the EXCO members.
- You may wish to contact Aunty Alice or Mr Sigmund Seow at 6570 1588 to inform either one of them how we could tap on your expertise to volunteer some of your time to support our children in their learning. For example, you may wish to volunteer your time to share an interesting learning experience and/or your career experience with our students on career option and life after school.
- You have also helped by giving us constructive feedback. We want to do better and we have been trying to put in place systems and structures to enable us to provide quality service and teaching. **Please accept our apologies should there be lapses but we will continue to do our best to work together with you to provide your child with an enriched education experience.**
- Our staff works hard because they care for your child and want your child to experience success in school. Please do take every opportunity to encourage our staff through your emails and complimentary notes.
