Enhancement to the Edusave Award for Achievement, Good Leadership and Service (EAGLES)

This year MOE has enhanced the Edusave Award for Achievement, Good Leadership and Service (EAGLES) to include a new **21st Century Competencies (21CC) domain** and the intent is to recognise students' exemplary demonstration of competencies both in curricular and co-curricular domains such as

- (i) Critical, Adaptive and Inventive Thinking,
- (ii) Civic, Global and Cross-Cultural Literacy
- (iii) Communication, Collaboration and Information Skills, in both curricular and co-curricular settings.

We acknowledge that students will be faced with future challenges due to globalization, changing demographics and technological advancements and thus we will strengthen our efforts to help students cultivate future-ready competencies that will better enable them to achieve their aspirations and contribute back to society. Update on the Assessment and Reporting of PE performance in PGVP

We are also excited to inform you about an important update in our Physical Education (PE) programme. Starting this year, we will be moving away from the traditional reporting of final grades for PE for Primary 3 to Primary 6 at the end of the year. Instead, we will implement an assessment portfolio approach, which will encompass both formative and summative assessments. This portfolio will provide parents with a comprehensive and ongoing evaluation of your child's progress, skills, and development in PE throughout the year.

By focusing on continuous assessment, we aim to offer a more developmental view of each student's achievements as well as identify areas for growth. This process will encourage a more positive and engaging learning experience in PE. We believe this change will better support your child's growth and foster a lifelong appreciation for physical activity and wellness.

Reporting of learning and development outcomes for PE at Primary 1 and 2 will continue to be via the Holistic Development Profile (HDP) format. Specifically, the HDP instrument makes use of qualitative descriptors (QDs) for each HDP learning outcome (HDP-LO) to report students' learning progress. HDP for PE will be reported at the end of each Semester. On top of this, they will also have their portfolio to report both formative and summative assessment.

P5 NE Show 2024

This year, the P5 NE Show for our school will be held on Sat, 6 Jul 2024. All our P5 students will be very excited to attend the annual birthday bash for Singapore’s National Day. Please refer to separate notification issued to P5 parents on 30 April 2024 (Ref : PGVP/162/2024) and 24 Jun 2024 (Ref: PGVP/202/2024) for more details about the NE Show. Students are to wear their red P5 Camp T-shirt and PE shorts for easy identification at the event.

Attendance and Temperature Taking Exercise (ATTEEx)

Our bi-annual ATTEEx will be conducted on Wed, 3 Jul 2024. ATTEEx allows us to remain vigilant and step up our measures when necessary. ATTEEx will be carried out in the classroom for the children once they have reached school. During the exercise, students will be using their own thermometer to check their temperature. Please ensure that your child always has his/her own personal thermometer with him/her.

National Day Celebrations

Our school will commemorate National Day on Thu, 8 Aug 2024 with a morning of celebrations. We encourage our students to come dressed in red T-shirts with school shorts and school shoes on that day. If they do not have a red T-shirt, they may come in their PE attire. **All students will be dismissed**

at 10.30am on 8 Aug 2024. Please make the necessary arrangements for your child's dismissal. More information will be shared in a subsequent notification.

P1 & P2 Lower Primary Games Day

The lower primary games day will be conducted on Thu, 8 Aug 2024 after the National Day Celebrations. Do alert the respective form teacher if your child is unwell or recovering from a recent COVID infection.

School Closure for PSLE Oral and LC

The school will be closed on the PSLE Oral Examination (OE) days on Tue, 13 Aug and Wed, 14 Aug as well as the PSLE Listening Comprehension (LC) Examination Day on Fri, 13 Sep (Term 4). Therefore, P1-P5 students **do not** need to report to school on those 3 days. Instead, they will be having e-learning from home. The Student Care Centre will be open from 1pm - 7pm during those 3 days. Kindly note that apart from the P6 students, all other students will not be allowed into the school before 1pm.

Teachers' Day Celebration

Teachers' Day falls on Fri, 30 Aug 2024 and the school will celebrate Teachers' Day on Thu, 29 Aug 2024. Students will be dismissed at 10.30 am. on that day. Please make the necessary arrangement to facilitate the earlier dismissal timing. We want to encourage students who want to show their gratitude by creating their own gifts for their teachers (e.g. notes, letters, cards or crafts). We seek your understanding not to give expensive Teachers' Day presents as teachers are generally unable to accept such gifts.

Safety and Security

Ensuring school safety is of utmost importance to protect the safety and wellbeing of students and staff in the school. We want to take the opportunity to share with you our safety vision and mission which has also been communicated to your children.

In PGVP, we emphasise to our students that safety is everyone's responsibility and all of us have a part to play to help create a safe and secure school for all. Rest assured that as a school, we will adopt all reasonable and practicable measures to mitigate foreseeable accidents from taking place.

Ensuring traffic safety, particularly at our school porch, is a very important area of traffic management. This area is heavily utilized by our school, excursion buses, as well as parents picking up and dropping off their children. We would like to once again remind all parents that parking or waiting at our school porch/driveway is strictly prohibited. This designated space is for pick-up and drop-off only. We have prominently displayed "No Parking/Waiting" signs in this area to inform drivers, and we extend our gratitude to parents who have complied with this rule.

When picking up your child for CCA or after school activities, if your child has not yet arrived at the designated pick-up point, we kindly request that you drive to either available white or red lots and

wait for them there. You are to remain in your vehicles while waiting. Only proceed to drive to the pick-up point when you spot your child. We also appreciate your cooperation to arrive and pick up on time and not be too early.
