5. Students' Achievements

a. PSLE Results 2025

Our 2025 Primary 6 cohort has made the school proud with a strong PSLE performance, achieving a 100% pass rate. This achievement reflects the dedication of our students, the commitment of our teachers, and the steadfast support of our parents.

We are pleased to celebrate 35 students who attained a PSLE Score of 10 or better.

At PGVP, we value multiple pathways to success. This year, 22 students were admitted through the Direct School Admission (DSA) scheme and have been successfully posted to the secondary schools of their choice. We congratulate them on this achievement.

6. School Hours and Daily Routine

a. Flag Raising Ceremony, Attendance and Punctuality

- Flag Raising begins at 7.30am daily
- Students should arrive in school on time and be at their reporting venues by 7.25am
- Students may enter the school from 6.55am. Those who arrive earlier will wait in the canteen.

b. Curriculum Time

- Curriculum time will now be from 7.45 am to 1.45 pm
- As a result of this 15-minute adjustment to the dismissal time, school bus transport will depart the school at 1.55 pm.
- This may result in your child returning home slightly later than usual.

e. P3-P6 CARE and E2K

After-school stretch and support programmes are available for **selected students**.

- **P3-P6 CARE Programme:**
 - Focuses on helping specific students bridge learning gaps in each subject.
 - Conducted by subject for selected P3 - P6 students.
 - Students are identified at the start of the year and reviewed periodically.
- **E2K Math and E2K Science:**
 - Stretch programmes for Mathematics and Science respectively.
 - Conducted for selected P4 and P5 students.

More details on each programme will be shared with parents via **PG**.

7. Weighted Assessment (WA)

- Mid-year examinations have been removed across all levels.
- Students' learning progress is assessed through Weighted Assessments (WA) conducted throughout the year during regular lessons.

More details can be found in the Student Handbook. Additional information will be shared with parents separately.

8. Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) and CCA Open House

CCA is offered to students from Primary 3 onwards, with a range of options to cater to different interests. More details are available in the Student Handbook.

- P4–P6 CCAs will commence in Term 1, Week 3
- A CCA Open House for P3 students will be held in Term 2, allowing students to experience the CCAs before making a choice.
- Formal CCA for P3 will begin in Term 3.

Further details on the Open House will be shared in due course.

9. Cultivating the Value of Responsibility

a. Attendance and Punctuality matters

- Students are considered late if they arrive after 7.30am
- Absences must be supported by a medical certificate or a parent's letter (maximum 5 letters per semester)
- Parents are reminded it is compulsory for students to attend school during curriculum days and they should not plan travel during curriculum days

b. Cultivating independence and responsibility

We encourage students to:

- Pack their own school bags
- Take responsibility for personal belongings
- Avoid bringing valuables or excessive money to school

Parents are advised **not to deliver** forgotten items (e.g. homework, pocket money).

Students may approach the General Office if assistance is needed.

10. Communication With Parents

The school communicates primarily via:

- Parents Gateway (PG)
- School website
- PGVP Quarterly

Parents who have not downloaded and activated the MOE Parents Gateway (PG) app are required to do so promptly. Most school communications and consent forms, including the PGVP Quarterly, are disseminated exclusively via the PG platform.

Parents are encouraged to contact teachers via email. Messages may also be left via the General Office. Queries received after office hours will be attended to on the next working day.

From time to time, teachers may also communicate with parents via platforms such as ClassDojo. We appreciate parents' understanding that teachers are not obliged to share their personal mobile phone numbers

b. Student Handbook 2026

The student handbook is also an important channel of communication between our teachers and parents. The first copy is provided free-of-charge and is therefore not included in the booklist. The handbook contains key information on the school's vision, mission, values, and important guidelines covering all aspects of school life. Students will also use the handbook to record homework and reflections as guided by their teachers.

Your child will receive the Student Handbook from their Form Teacher shortly.

c. Other forms of communication:

d. Guidelines for School-Home Partnership

11. Safety, Security and School Access

- All visitors must register at the security post and wear a visitor sticker
- Parents are not allowed to enter classrooms
- There is no parent entry during main dismissal (1.35pm – 2.05pm) to allow smooth dismissal of our students.
- The school gates and their locations are listed on below. A layout plan is also found in the 2026 Student Handbook.

b. Morning Arrival and Dismissal Arrangements

Students are to use the following gates when they come to school in the morning. Please refer to the summary below.

**The school's Gate 1, 2 and 8 will be opened until 8.00 am during inclement weather.*

- Morning arrival by car (Gate 1):
- Vehicle entry is from 6.30am to 7.30am, with students alighting at the designated drop-off point.
- Parents are discouraged from alighting from their vehicles to ensure smooth traffic flow.
- Gate 1 will close at 7.30am for flag raising and reopen after the ceremony.
- Due to ongoing MRT works and traffic diversions, parents are advised to factor in additional travel time.

- All students will be dismissed via Gates 3, 4 and 5, with Gate 3 used for students attending CARE and CCA. Gate 2 is for P3–P6 students going home independently; parents are discouraged from waiting there due to the narrow walkway.
- From 2.00pm, students who have not been collected will be guided to the General Office Foyer for safety. Parents arriving after gates have closed should enter Gate 1 via Gate 1 and sign in at the foyer.
- For car pick-up, vehicle entry begins from about 2.00pm, after school buses have departed.

d. Cycling and Kick Scooter Safety

We remind families of the importance of students' safety when cycling or using kick scooters to and from school.

Parents' support is essential. We seek your cooperation to:

- Review the advisory with your child
- Reinforce safety practices, including wearing protective gear and staying alert

e. Use of Mobile Phones and Smart Watches (With Effect from 2026)

There is no need to seek permission for your child to bring a mobile phone or smartwatch to school.

- Mobile phones and electronic devices (except POSB Smart Buddy) must not be used during the school day.
- If brought to school, devices must be:
 - Switched off at all times
 - Kept securely in a ziplock bag provided by parents
- Mobile phones and smartwatches may only be switched on and used at the school gates after dismissal.

We seek parents' support in guiding and reminding children to adhere strictly to these guidelines so as to maintain a focused and safe learning environment for all students.

f. Buying of Books and Stationery

- Parents may purchase books and stationery from the bookshop after dismissal, from 2.05pm to 2.30pm, and are required to register at the Security Guard Post before entering.
- The bookshop closes promptly at 2.30pm.
- To encourage independence, students are encouraged to purchase their own items.
- The bookshop accepts cashless payments via POSB Smart Buddy.

g. Student Care Centre (SCC)

- Please follow the SCC dismissal schedule which the SCC has shared with you.
- During SCC dismissal, parents may enter the school to pick up their child.
- **No parking is allowed at the foyer/drop-off point.**

12. Photography and Videography by the school

- Photographs and/or video recordings of students and parents/guardians may be taken during school activities and events.
- These may be used for school publications, the school website, social media platforms, and other official school communication channels.
